FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him..." ~1 Corinthians 1:4-5

It's November again, and the holidays are just around the corner, starting with Thanksgiving! Some times it's a challenge to give thanks in our lives, but the Apostle encourages us to give thanks in *all* things, even when we may not feel like it. Holidays like Thanksgiving give us the opportunity to remember all that we have and everything God has done for us throughout the year. And we celebrate those blessings with family and friends around a festive table!

In the Jewish tradition, handed down from the time of Moses, the need for regular celebrations and festivals is part of our faith and praise to God. In the Hebrew Bible there are *at least* 11 festivals and holy days (holidays) each year. And that doesn't include the weekly practice of Sabbath.

Paul, perhaps out of his own Jewish tradition or perhaps from his personal struggles and hardships, reminds us to praise God at all times. In his letter to the church in Ephesus he says to not only sing hymns and psalms but to "speak to one another" with them. After all, when we sing hymns and raise our voices in worship, we are singing to and praising God.

For a congregation, focusing on giving thanks to God can help prevent the negativity that may seem endemic in our world.

Giving thanks and celebrating how God is at work in and through our congregation is also a way to keep our mission before us – to see and take advantage of opportunities and live our church lives wisely. Grateful congregations can do more – even in the midst of the very real struggles they face.

When we spend our time and energy celebrating, praising, singing, and giving thanks, we open ourselves up as channels so that God can work through us.

So, as this holiday season begins, let us see them as gifts from God and welcome the opportunities to eat, drink, sing, and celebrate our church, our community, our families, and our blessings!

 - -Suggestion to purchase patriotic banner for Veteran's/Memorial Days


New business:



TRUSTEES TEAM REPORT

October 2019 Trustees meeting.

Attendees: Rick Williams, Robert Humphrey, Ed Sutcliffe, Tim Terry, Pastor Ken Berve.

Issues requiring future repairs:

- Rick Williams will be stepping down as head of trustees on 1-1-2020.
- Wesley Room Thermostat needs to be installed, it is located in Pastor Kens office.
- Need to install vent fans in Ed building restrooms (purchased and located in church basement storage room)
- · Remove closet in parsonage to make living room larger.
- Propose to install new steel carport to replace old carport on parsonage. Ed to found one at Lowes that costs \$1500 with sides, we will install it. I will present this to the Admin Counsel.
- Roy Christenson said he would like to use Shannon's donation funds for Education building kitchen. We will be getting feedback from the ladies on layout ideas.
- New Windows have been installed in parsonage: Last window has been installed.

- Pastor Ken has installed backflow preventers on each building.
- Ceiling tile at entrance to sanctuary needs to be fixed.
- · Need to get rid of old paint and unneeded stuff under basement stairs.
- New sound board for sanctuary needs to be purchased (Medill funds will be used).
- New tents have been purchased and old tents have been sold.
- Need to replace basement door with steel door and crash bar.
- Organ needs to go away, need Adas approval first.
- For safety reasons we need to install windows on interior doors of education building.
- Need to search for source of foul smell in kitchen, may be a drain venting problem.
- Need to do walk through of all buildings prior to end of year with Pastor Ken.
- Rick and Diane will donate funds to purchase new faucets for Education Building kitchen.
- Need to call for boiler maintence / inspection: Dale Dennigan or Les Coy
- Need to measure and purchase shades for Wesley room windows to reduce glare on monitors.
- I have requested that the church look into hiring a part time maintenance person to care for the every day maintenance issues.
